# The Tomato Lady

	<p><b>Cherry</b></p>
	<p><b>Yellow Pear</b> An heirloom, they grow on tall, rangy plants and bear in heavy clusters of 1 3/4 inch sized fruits. Children especially love their unique shape. Mild flavored, sweet, perfect for salads or straight from the vine. Indeterminate, 78 days</p>
	<p><b>Orange Sungold</b> <b>Personal Favorite!</b> Delicious, juicy and sweet. Sungold positively glows with an intense golden orange color. Foliage is a pretty bluish green color. Fusarium, TMV and crack resistant. One of the best tomatoes I've ever eaten and very popular with customers. Indeterminate, Hybrid, 57 days</p>
	<p><b>Juliet</b> Sweet flavored fruits shaped like grapes. Glossy red and crack resistant, they stay on the vine longer than other cherry tomatoes. I grew these in planter boxes last year and they were delicious. Indeterminate, Hybrid, 60 days</p>
	<p><b>Tumbler</b> Specially bred for hanging baskets. Bushy plants look fantastic mixed with lobelia and alyssum. Sweet, bright red fruits. Determinate, Hybrid, 45 days</p>
	<p><b>Super Sweet 100</b> These plants will need staking or caging but will reward you by producing long strands of super sweet red tomatoes and are extra high in Vitamin C. Great in salads or right off the vine. Indeterminate, Hybrid, VF, 65 days</p>

	<p><b>Sugary</b> <b>Personal Favorite!</b> I've grown these for several years and I really love these tomatoes. The super sweet flavor and pink skins are absolutely wonderful. The oval-shaped, slightly pointed fruits are very productive and will always have place in my garden. Semi-determinate, 80 days.</p>
	<p><b>Green Grape</b> <b>Personal Favorite!</b> These are the first, fully ripened green cherry tomato. You don't expect them to be as yummy as they are when you bite into them. Fruits are delicious, juicy and sweet. They turn a lovely golden green when ripe and are wonderful straight from the vine. Mix with Sweet Million and Sungold cherry tomatoes for a rainbow infused salad. Use for a large container planting on your deck. Determinate, 70 days</p>
	<p><b>Isis Candy</b> <b>Personal Favorite!</b> These are great tomatoes and one of our family favorites. They are a marbled reddish color with a starburst on the underside. Sweet and fruity. Heavy yields of short trusses, in double rows, of 6 to 8 fruits each. Indeterminate. 70-80 days.</p>
	<p><b>Jolly</b> AAS Winner! A large pink fruited cherry that will change the minds of those who feel that most cherry tomatoes lack flavor. Good acid content and exceptionally sweet flavor in meaty fruits that are produced in clusters of 9 to 14, weighing about 1-1/2 oz. apiece, with a distinct peach shape. Indeterminate, Hybrid, 70-75 days</p>
	<p><b>Jelly Bean</b> Small, sweet, intensely red cherry tomatoes grow in clusters of 15-30 fruits, and are oblong shaped like grapes. The fruit resists cracking and hold well on the vine for days. Indeterminate, Hybrid, VFFASt, 72 days.</p>



### SunSugar

Just 1/2 ounce each, these golden-yellow fruits are bursting with tomato tang and sugar. For full-bodied flavor that captures the old-fashioned "tomato essence" so sadly lacking in many modern varieties, rely on SunSugar! Despite thin skins, they are quite crack-resistant, so you can let them mature on the plant fearlessly! It is very heavy-bearing all season, a great choice for large families and tomato lovers everywhere! Indeterminate. 62-67 days



### Suncherry Extra Sweet

Bite sized, super sweet and thin skinned. What more could you ask of a cherry tomato? These are vigorous plants producing a wealth of bright red fruits. Indeterminate, Hybrid FT, 55-60 days



### Tumbling Tom Yellow

This magnificent variety cascades to 20" or more, making it ideal for hanging baskets and container gardens. Sturdy, evenly branched plants are loaded with juicy, 1 to 2" fruits, perfectly sized for snacking and salads. A true ornamental that may seem too pretty to pick, but one sweet bite will have you coming back for more! Alternate red and yellow in hanging baskets for an eye-popping display. Determinate. 70 days



### Tumbling Tom Red

Perfect for hanging baskets and containers, this plant cascades 18 inches over the container's edge, bearing lots of bright red, 1" to 2" cherry tomatoes that are deliciously sweet. Plants grow about 6" wide, so you can place several in a 12" pot for a very attractive display. This is a great variety for gardeners with limited space. Determinate. 70 days.



### Gold Nugget Tomato

Vigorous plants bear numerous golden-yellow, fine-flavored, 1" oval "nuggets". Uniform, compact plants, averaging 24" in height, begin fruiting extra-early. Indeterminate, 60 days



### Sweet Baby Girl

**Personal Favorite!** We loved this one. Let it get really red and ripe. We found it to be sweet and juicy, just the way I like a tomato. Crack-resistant, bright red fruits weigh less than 1 oz. and keep well after harvest. Resists Tobacco Mosaic Virus. Indeterminate, 65 days



### Italian Ice

Sugary sweet and bursting with juicy flavor. Clusters of 1" to 1 1/2" snack-sized fruits ripen from green to ivory white. These are really good tomatoes. We grew them last year. Very prolific and delicious. Indeterminate, Hybrid, 65 days



### Sungella

A breeding triumph that crosses ever-popular Sungold with a larger, orange-skinned heirloom to create these orange, golf ball sized fruits. Plants produce heavy trusses of 2 oz. fruits with superb flavor and low acidity, juicy and sweet. Indeterminate, Hybrid, 90 days



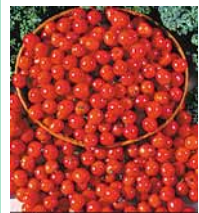
### Sugar Lump

Sweet German heirloom that produces heavy yields straight through until frost. Clusters of 6 to 12 smooth, deep-red fruits, each averaging 3/4" to 1" in diameter. Excellent eating quality and flavor. Indeterminate, 65-75 days



### Ghost Cherry

Prolific large, 1-1 1/2", white cherry tomato. Very sweet. 75 days



### Riesentraube

The name of this German heirloom variety means 'giant bunch of grapes,' and that is what clusters of these cherry tomatoes will remind you of. Bouquet-type blossoms turn into bunches of 20 to 40 small, oval red fruit with pointed ends. Vines are very branched, and become covered with fruit. Flavor is excellent, offering taste found in larger tomatoes. Indeterminate. 80 days



### Super Snow White

Very sweet, 2 oz., ivory-colored cherry tomatoes, larger than Snow White, but similar in taste. They ripen to reach almost the size of ping pong balls. These tomatoes are perfect for cutting in half to expose the beautiful interior and serving in salads. Indeterminate. 75 days



### Red Pear

Miniature pear-shaped tomatoes are 1-3/4" to 2" long and bright red. Flavorful and sweet, they are great for salads and as a companion to 'Yellow Pear'. Indeterminate. 78 days



### Ladybug

Crack resistant and widely adapted! You'll love the ease of growth and the sweet, sweet flavor of this charming new Cherry! Widely adapted to many parts of the country, Ladybug is a delight for Tomato growers everywhere! These little 1-ounce fruits are very resistant to cracking, the scourge of many a Cherry Tomato. They are ultra-sweet, with a good solids-to-gel ratio. And they arise by the hundred on indeterminate plants! Indeterminate. 65 days



### Sprite

If you love grape tomatoes, but don't have the space for supports to grow tall plants, Sprite offers a wonderful alternative. There is no sacrifice in fruit quality, size, productivity, or flavor - just shorter plants for smaller gardens. The small red oval grape tomatoes are borne in amazingly large numbers on more compact, determinate plants. Their taste is refreshingly sweet and skins are thin and crisp, just like the original Grape tomatoes. Determinate. 60 days



### Black Cherry

**Personal Favorite!** Loved it and will grow it again, you will adore this blackish-purple skinned, cherry tomato with dark red flesh and a sweet and juicy flavour. It produces sweet and juicy fruits in abundance throughout the summer. Indeterminate, 80 days

## Patio



### Better Bush

Perfect for large containers or small gardens, this has long been a favorite choice for growing on patios, decks, and balconies. That is because the compact plants are attractive while yielding good-sized 8 oz. fruit with real tomato flavor. Stocky plants grow 3 to 4 ft. tall with an upright habit, making staking needs minimal. Compact indeterminate. 68 days



### Bush Champion

One of the best varieties for small space gardens and containers. Compact plants grow to just 24" tall, producing extra-early yields of big, 8 to 12 oz. fruits with excellent flavor. Good disease resistance. Determinate, Hybrid, VFFASt, 65 days



### Bush Goliath

Specially developed for patio gardeners and those with limited garden space. Its attractive, compact plants grow up to 3-1/2 ft. tall and have a "patio" look...the surprise is their huge, red, 3 to 4" fruits packed with flavorful meat and high sugar content. Bears consistently up to frost and needs little staking. Determinate, Hybrid, VFN, 68 days



### Bush Early Girl Tomato

(VF) All the desirable qualities of Early Girl in a compact, patio-type variety: extreme earliness, firm, meaty, flavorful fruits, blemish-resistant skin with yields all summer long. Fruits are a full 4" in diameter, bright red and slightly flattened. Determinate. 63 days



### Bush Beefsteak

**Personal Favorite!** This was a great plant. We put it in a pot and it had the most amazing clusters of large tomatoes for such a small plant. Compact, bushy plants yield an early abundance of big clusters of 6 to 8 oz. rich red, beefsteak-shaped fruit. Popular in the North because of its earliness, productivity, and large fruit size. Determinate. 62 days



### Patio

Perfect for container gardening or limited space. Vines are extremely compact, yet produce medium-sized, deep oblate fruits that are smooth, firm and flavorful. This was a nice tomato and had surprisingly large fruits for a plant this size. Determinate, Hybrid, 70 days

## Early



### Subarctic

Allegedly developed in the 1940's by the U.S. Military to provide fresh tomatoes to their troops in Greenland. If your weather turns cold after you set out plants, try this variety. Sets hundreds of small, 1 to 2", red fruits with that tart, "real tomato" flavor. Hardier than virtually any other variety we offer. Extremely early maturity. No need to stake. Determinate. 52 - 55 days



### Early Girl

Bears heavy crops extremely early, continues longer than most varieties. Large clusters of 5 oz. fruits. Bright red and meaty with a lot of flavor and aroma. Indeterminate, 59 days.



### **Oregon Spring**

Consistently 10 days earlier than Early Girl, Oregon Spring is a compact plant bearing fine flavored, nearly seedless, tomatoes. This is one of our favorites. Great for cooler climates & container planting. Determinate, 60 days



### **Stupice**

**Personal Favorite!** A native of Czechoslovakia, where it's extreme earliness, tolerance to cold, and high yields have earned it worldwide attention. Fruits are sugary sweet, weighing 1 to 2 oz. This tomato has earned it's place in my garden. Great taste. Indeterminate, 52 days



### **Polar Beauty**

This variety earns its name for the beautifully shaped, deep red fruit it bears very early in the season. Developed in Alaska for colder climates, it bears small to medium-sized oblate tomatoes with a good, full tomato taste. Short, bushy plants are very productive. Determinate. 63 days.



### **Fireworks**

This is one of the largest, earliest red slicing tomatoes available, and it has excellent flavor. Fireworks is an exceptional variety. Its bright red fruit are 6 to 8 ozs., round with a pointed tip, and borne quite heavily on vigorous plants. Indeterminate. 60 days.



### **Ultimate Opener**

This new tomato developed by the same breeder of Early Girl and Better Boy Hybrids. Strong, vigorous plants are capable of tremendous yields. I will be growing this again, they were delicious and larger. Strong disease resistance. VF, Indeterminate, 57 days



### **Siberia**

This might be the earliest tomato ever - only 7 weeks from transplanting to table. Capable of setting fruits at 38 F on sturdy dark green plants. The fruits are bright red, 3 to 5 oz. and bunch in clusters. Also good for a patio. Determinate, 48 day.



### **Jetsetter**

Short season gardeners especially will be happy for this variety that doesn't sacrifice size or flavor for early maturity. Tomatoes are at least 8 ozs. and often larger with really good, rich flavor. Yields are plentiful on vigorous plants that have lots of disease resistance. VFFNTA Indeterminate. 64 days



### **Manitoba**

An extremely early variety developed by the Morden Experiment Farm in Manitoba for southern Canadian prairies. Particularly well suited for extreme northern areas. Fruits are bright red, slightly flattened, good-flavored, and weigh about 6 oz. each. Easily grown in a small area. Determinate, 60 days



### **Sugar Baby**

Extremely early harvests of super-sweet tomatoes on compact plants make this variety a wonderful addition to anyone's garden. These 1 to 2 oz. tomatoes will likely be among the first of the season, and their sweet, delicious flavor is sure to be a delight. Plants are small, but very productive. Determinate. 54 days.



### **Siletz**

Very large and early maturing, it produces flavorful deep red, round fruit ideal for slicing. Fruit size is 10 to 12 ounces or even more on plants. Produces even during cooler weather. Another outstanding OSU intro by Dr. Jim Baggett. Determinate, 65 days



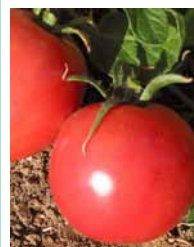
### **Glacier**

Extremely early, cold-tolerant, high yielding special strain of tomato plant. Begins flowering when only 4" high. You can expect higher-than-average yields of 2 to 3 oz. fruits with outstanding flavor for such an early tomato. Semi-determinate, 45 days



### **Early Goliath**

Superb size, perfect shape, continuous production. Luscious flavor and broad disease resistance all add up to an early tomato that will give Early Girl a run for her money. Extra large harvests of big, 8 oz. red sweet fruits. Indeterminate, Hybrid, VFFNTASt, 58 days



### **Early Wonder**

**Personal Favorite!** Extra-early maturing and compact variety that yields an abundant crop of round, dark-pink, great-tasting fruit. Perfect for gardeners in shorter season growing climates. Determinate, 55 days.



### **Fourth of July**

The first tomato to ripen by Independence Day! Be the first on your block to have vine ripened red, luscious tomatoes by the Fourth of July. Enjoy the plentiful harvest about 49 days after setting plants in the garden. Indeterminate, 50 days



### Manitoba

An extremely early variety developed by the Morden Experiment Farm in Manitoba for southern Canadian prairies. Particularly well suited for extreme northern areas. Fruits are bright red, slightly flattened, good-flavored, and weigh about 6 oz. each. Easily grown in a small area. Determinate, 60 days



### Alaskan Fancy

Excellent for those short-season summers, these are the earliest plum tomatoes available in today's market! Its earliness does not detract one bit from its juicy flavor! Fruits are 2" x 1-1/2" and weigh about 2 oz. each. Determinate, 55 days

## Paste



### Roma

The number one choice for home canning and sauces for years. Fruits are medium sized and hang in large clusters. Perfect for canning. Determinate, VFN, 80 days.



### Speckled Roman

SSE member John Swenson, developed this cross of Antique Roman and Banana Legs. Orange-red, 5" long fruits are a speckled paste-type, marked by irregular yellow stripes. Meaty fruits have hearty, "real tomato" flavor and almost no seeds. This is a neat looking tomato. Indeterminate. 85 days.



### Amish Paste

**Personal Favorite!** This one dates back to the turn of the century and is the best for sauces and canning. It bears large 8 oz. deep red fruits with "real" tomato flavor. Indeterminate, 60 days



### Principe Borghese

Plum-shaped Italian variety favored for drying. Make your own sun dried tomatoes. Meaty tomatoes have very little juice and few seeds. Small plants become extremely loaded with fruit. Determinate, 75 days



### Viva Italia VFFNA Hybrid

Beautiful, deep red elongated oval with very solid flesh and a higher natural sugar content. This sugar coupled with ample acid make these tomatoes tastier for fresh eating, as well as for canning, freezing, and sauces or salsa. Sets fruit better in hot weather than the original Roma. Determinate, 75 days.



### Opalka

**Personal Favorite!** Fruits are more flavorful than most paste tomatoes. A long, pepper-shaped type with fruits that grow to 4 to 6" long. It can be eaten straight off the vine, but is prized for sauces and canning. Foliage is wispy but it produces heavy crops. Heirloom from Poland. I will grow this again. Indeterminate. 75 days



### Polish Linguisa

**Personal Favorite!** Loaded with vitamins, fiber and potassium, but low in fat and sodium! *(Unlike it's meat counterpart)* This 19th Century heirloom has vigorous plants that set more fruit than most heirlooms. Fruits are large and pie-shaped. I like this one better than Roma. Indeterminate, 73 days



### Pink Icicle

Very delicious, bright pink fruit are shaped like a dazzling pink icicle. The flavor is very sweet and rich, being one of the best tasting pink paste types. Perfect for salsas and preserving, but also to eat fresh out of hand right in the garden. Developed in the former Soviet Union, this is truly a masterpiece of tomato breeding. Determinate. 75 days



### Roman Candle

Beautiful, neon yellow banana-shaped fruits are bursting with intense sweetness and flavor. A wonderful new tomato that originated as a 'sport' from Mr. John Swenson's Speckled Roman. A new favorite of market growers that is quite colorful. Indeterminate. 85 days



### Cream Sausage

Here is a new and stunning tomato, an elongated paste tomato that is creamy white to pale yellow in color. With sweet flavor, this should be a hit with gourmet chefs. Bushy plants are quite productive. Think of the new sauce colors this beauty will create! A new "Must Have" variety.



### Banana Legs

Very prolific and long-lasting. These bright yellow, pointed, banana-shaped fruits, 4" long by 1-1/2" in diameter, are meaty and low in acid, making them especially good for slicing into salads. Determinate. 75 days



### Yummy

**Personal Favorite!** This is a paste tomato that we mistakenly grew last year. Apparently there was an error in seeds we got from a supplier and this is what came up. Fortunately, it was sweet and delicious and very prolific too. We picked bunches and bunches of these all season long. I will definitely grow them again. We were able to save seed from this. Indeterminate. 75-80 days



### Speckled Roman

SSE member John Swenson, developed this cross of Antique Roman and Banana Legs. Orange-red, 5" long fruits are a speckled paste-type, marked by irregular yellow stripes. Meaty fruits have hearty, "real tomato" flavor and almost no seeds. This is a neat looking tomato. Indeterminate. 85 days.



### Sausage

Here's an unusually shaped tomato with fruits up to 6" long, like huge, red banana peppers. A prolific paste tomato, with fine flavored meat that is especially ideal for ketchup or sauces. Indeterminate, 75 days.



### San Marzano

Slightly later than Romas, they have excellent flavor and hang in large clusters. Holds well on the vine and has extra-high solids for canning. The fruits are slightly rectangular in shape. Indeterminate, 80 days

## Heirloom



### Aunt Ruby's German Green

Don't let the color fool you, this one is good. Too me, it has a sweet almost winery flavor and looks cool on a plate of multi-hued tomatoes. Globe-shaped fruits are smooth skinned, 12 to 16 oz., with light green skins at maturity and just a hint of yellow. Flesh is green blushed with pink, meaty, and flavorful. Indeterminate, 80 days



### Georgia Streak

**Personal Favorite!** This is a beautiful beefsteak tomato that is predominantly golden yellow with a red blush. Streaks of red run throughout the flesh. Tomatoes range from 1 to 2 lbs. and have an excellent sweet, fruity taste. From Georgia. Indeterminate. 90 days.



### Marvel Stripe

This has become one of gardeners' favorite bicolored tomatoes due to its beauty, size, and taste. Large yellow-orange fruits, streaked with ruby red and have a sweet, fruity taste that is absolutely delicious. Tomatoes weigh about 1 lb. Large harvests on vigorous vines. Indeterminate. 85 days.



### Druzba

A Bulgarian heirloom introduced in 1995. (Druzba means friendship in Bulgarian.) Produces big harvests of smooth, blemish-free, round, deep-red, juicy, 10-ounce fruits. Excellent, robust, sweet/tart, juicy flavors. Good disease resistance. Indeterminate. 80 days



### Anna Russian

An heirloom oxheart variety from Brenda Hillenius, of Oregon, who got from her grandfather, Kenneth Wilcox, who received seeds from a Russian immigrant. An excellent, gorgeous tomato. Early maturing for a heart-shaped tomato, the large, visually beautiful, pink-red fruit normally weighs about 1 pound. Superb rich old-fashioned, tomatoey flavors with lots of juice. Indeterminate. 70 days



### Aussie

A favorite heirloom tomato variety from Australia. This is a dependable red heirloom tomato for the market, home and as a show tomato. These tomatoes are indeterminate, regular-leaf tomato plants that dependably yield picture-perfect, copious amounts of 1-2 lb., glossy-red, meaty, fluted, beefsteak tomatoes that are LOADED with delicious, bold, rich and complex tomatoey flavors. Great disease resistance. A winner! A Gary Ibsen of Tomatofest favorite. Indeterminate. 85 days



### Chuck's Yellow

Outstanding 1-2 lb. yellow/orange beefsteak tomato named for gardener and seedsman Chuck Wyatt. A dependable and prolific producer of large, meaty, deliciously sweet tomatoes. Indeterminate. 77 days



### Persimmon

This vigorous and prolific heirloom, introduced around 1983, yields lots of fruit. One of the better flavors of all the orange tomatoes. Rose-orange (persimmon colored) fruits range from 12-ounces to 2 pounds. Meaty, very sweet, and few seeds. Indeterminate. 79 days

**Evergreen**

A solid, medium-sized, green slicer, with full, mild and delicious flavors. One of the best tasting greens.

**Rose**

A large leafy heirloom that produces deep, rose-pink, 3-inch, meaty globes with a taste that rivals those varieties heralded most for their luscious taste. Seed came from Dr. Grace Kaiser, a physician in New Holland, PA who was given the seed from one of her Amish patients. 78 days

**Seattle Best of All**

A mild tasting tomato that is a good all purpose, medium sized red. The vines are high yielding and the plant has good foliage. This variety was developed by a Seattle market gardener out of the greenhouse variety called 'Best-of-All' for his Seattle market garden. It was listed by the famous Gill Brothers Catalog in the 1960s. 60-70 days

**Rose de Berne**

Beautiful, nicely-shaped 4-to 8-oz fruit are a rose-pink color and have an excellent sweet flavor that has made it a hit with many growers. The vines set good yields of this lovely variety from Historic Switzerland. Indeterminate. 75 days

**Big Rainbow**

**Personal Favorite!** This spectacular heirloom tomato originally from Polk County, MN. Big, sprawling, indeterminate, regular-leaf tomato plants yield moderate to large crops of 1-2 lb. rib-shouldered bi-colored beefsteak tomatoes with gold flesh and beautiful red streaks running throughout. As fruits ripen they have a rainbow appearance: greens on the shoulder, yellow, orange, gold in the middle, and red on the blossom end. Very juicy and fruity sweet. Good disease resistance. A late producer. Great for slicing thick into sandwiches or salads. 85 days

**Hillbilly**

A customer of mine gave this seed to me. The tomatoes are beautiful. An Ohio heirloom beefsteak originally from West Virginia producing 1-2 lb. huge, heavily-ribbed, orange-yellow fruit with red mottled skin and red streaks within. Very sweet, fruity flavors. Low acid. Try it in big slices with other colored tomatoes. 85 days

**Paul Robeson**

**Personal Favorite!** Seed for this Russian heirloom was made available by Marina Danilenko, a Moscow seedswoman. This favorite tomato was named after the operatic artist who won acclaim as an advocate of equal rights for Blacks. His artistry was admired world-wide, especially in the Soviet Union. It's deep, rich colors stand it apart from others...a dusky, dark-red, with dark-green shoulders, and red flesh in it's center. Very flavorful fruits with a good acid/sweet balance. This variety originates from Siberia is an excellent choice for cooler growing regions. 74 days

**Arkansas Traveler**

A 100 year old heirloom tomato that was grown throughout the South from northwest Arkansas to North Carolina. Indeterminate, regular-leaf, 6', vigorous tomato plants, yield abundant crops of 8-ounce, round rose-pink tomatoes. Considered to be one of the best tasting tomato varieties with well balanced sweet/tart flavors. Arkansas Traveler is much esteemed for its ability to produce flavorful tomatoes under normally adverse conditions high heat, humidity or drought. Resistant to cracking and disease. 85 days

**Mr. Stripey**

Huge crops of red fruits with clearly defined yellow-orange stripes. 1-1/2 to 2 inch tomatoes have a rich, tangy flavor and are a beautiful novelty for adding whole or cutting into salads. Indeterminate. 56 days

**Virginia Sweets**

This heirloom variety is simply one of the best tasting, best producing gold-red bicolors. On top of that, the tomatoes are beautiful and enormous, weighing at least 1 pound each. Golden yellow, they have red stripes that turn into a ruby blush on top. Sweet and rich. In our garden they were huge and very pretty. Sweet too. Indeterminate. 80 days.

**Dr. Wyche's Yellow**

Named after Dr. Wyche who supposedly lived in the mountains and fertilized his garden with elephant manure from a nearby zoo. A beefsteak heirloom that produces slightly flattened, smooth, blemish-free, golden-yellow fruit with a meaty interior and few seeds. It's rich flavor and larger size sets this variety apart from other yellow heirlooms. Indeterminate, 80 days



### Golden Queen, USDA Strain

**Personal Favorite!** Really pretty tomato in my garden. Different from other Golden Queens sold, this is from a strain obtained from the USDA seed bank, and is the original Golden Queen described by the seedsman Livingston in 1882. Tomatoes are 8-12 ozs., yellow with a pronounced pink blush on the blossom end. It is delicious, with a full tomato taste that is also very sweet. Indeterminate. 75 days.



### German Red Strawberry Tomato

**Personal Favorite!** Loved it! Big, meaty and fine flavored in our garden. This German heirloom is the quintessential sandwich tomato. Delicious, uniform fruits resemble strawberries, but are much larger, averaging 10 oz. and 3-1/2" long. Solid meat has few seeds and little juice, yet delivers big on taste. Indeterminate, 80 days



### Mortgage Lifter

**Personal Favorite!** These long time favorites are also known as Radiator Charlie. They produce good yields of large, smooth, pink-skinned fruits and have few seeds, even in times of drought. Mild, sweet flavor. We love these! Last year we had 1-2 Lb. tomatoes. Indeterminate, 75-85 days



### Brandywine Pink

Many gardeners consider this strain the best Brandywine with fruit that is superior in taste and smoothness. Its tomatoes are indeed special, 1 to 2 pound pink beefsteaks with the delectably complex, rich, sweet flavor that has made Brandywine justifiably famous. Indeterminate. 85 days



### Brandywine, Red

**Personal Favorite!** This special strain of Red Brandywine comes from Chester County, Pennsylvania, where it originated in 1885. It produces medium-sized, 8 to 12 oz. round, smooth red fruit that are juicy and loaded with intense tomato flavor. This foliage is shaped like a regular tomato leaf. Expect high yields of this very flavorful tomato. In our garden last year, I actually liked this one better than the pink variety, it produced more tomatoes. and prettier tomatoes Indeterminate. 78 day



### Kellogg's Breakfast

**Personal Favorite!** One of our favorites. Lovely, pale-orange fruits are solid and meaty throughout, packed with mild, superb-tasting flesh. A long-season producer of large, beefsteak-type fruits, up to 16 oz., with solid centers that have just a few seeds at the edges. We had 2 pounders last year. Another favorite of mine! Indeterminate, 80-85 days



### Cherokee Purple

A reliable producer of unusual, medium pink-purple fruits that appear brown in color, and average 8 to 12 oz., a piece. Fruits are round to oblate, with no cracking. Exhibits tolerance to mild drought as well as to common diseases. Indeterminate, 80-90 days



### Cuore di Bue

A selection of 'Oxheart type', later maturing, producing large, meaty fruits about 1/2 lb in weight. Fruits are ribbed and ripen to an orangy-red color. The flesh is meaty, ideal for slicing and of superb flavor. This was a large one in my garden. Indeterminate, 85 days



### Amana Orange

I was surprised by it's size, color and flavor. Their deep golden orange added a very colorful element to my sandwiches and salads. The flavor was mild, sweet, delicious and the flesh very smooth to the tongue. This heirloom takes its name from Amana, Iowa. Indeterminate, 90 days



### German Johnson Pink

An old-time favorite heirloom from the East features tall plants and a fairly early harvest of large, slightly ribbed pink-red tomatoes averaging 1 lb. Meaty with few seeds and really excellent flavor. This one has stood the test of time for a number of reasons, specifically it's truly superior flavor. Indeterminate. 80 days.



### Mr. Stripecy

Another one we loved in our garden last year. It produced the biggest tomato we had, over 2 pounds! I was gorgeous red and yellow-striped heirloom variety that tasted great. Large, ridge-shouldered fruits are mild-flavored and low in acid. 80 days



### Aunt Gertie's Gold

Not only one of the best-tasting yellow tomatoes, it is one of the best-tasting tomatoes of any color. Fruit is about 1 lb. with beautiful golden color. The delicious taste is absolutely wonderful, fruity and sweet. From Virginia. Indeterminate. 75-80 days.



### Box Car Willie

Ok. We liked this one too. It had nice crop of good-sized, smooth red tomatoes with delicious flavor. They weren't as big as I thought they would be, but they tasted great and were a normal size. Indeterminate. 80 days



### **Costoluto Genovese**

Italian heirloom tomatoes. Large, deep-red, juicy tomatoes are deeply ribbed but fully flavored and absolutely delicious. This variety is hearty and does well in hot weather, but continues to produce even when the weather turns cool. Indeterminate. 78 days



### **Pineapple**

**Personal Favorite!** One of my personal favorites. I don't get a lot but it is well worth the growing space. The first one I ever picked was a "two hander" size! When I sliced it in half, I knew I was in love. The interior was a beautiful collage of orange, gold and red. Juicy and fruity sweet. Indeterminate, 85-90 days



### **Vintage Wine**

**Personal Favorite!** Excellent tomato! One of the very few pastel-hued tomatoes. A favorite of my customers, with attractive, 1lb., pale pink/red fruits set off by golden stripes. Elegant, sweet and tasty, with a nice, mild flavor. Potato-leaved foliage. Indeterminate. 85 days



### **Tangerine**

Heirloom variety reintroduced in 1992. Deep yellow-orange, large beefsteak fruit is shaped like a tangerine. The texture is meaty and flavor is both sweet and rich, quite delicious. This variety is a heavy producer. Indeterminate. 80 to 85 days



### **Great White**

**Personal Favorite!** These are good. Their flavor is sweet and fruity. A magnificent, almost perfect, "white" tomato with low acidity and few seeds. Good drought and crack tolerance. Fruits are protected under vigorous, heavy foliage. Indeterminate, 85 days

## **Main Season**



### **Carmello**

This tomato is very popular in European markets due to its taste, productivity and disease resistance. A heavy producer, it's exquisite straight from the vine and since it doesn't travel well, the only way you can try these are to grow them yourselves. Crack resistant. Indeterminate, Hybrid, 70 days



### **Rutgers Tomato**

All-purpose variety, ideal for canning. Ripens evenly from inside out. Bright red fruits with heavy walls average about 7 oz. Attractive, old-time favorite. Full-bodied flavor and disease resistant. VFASt, 75 days



### **Super Beefsteak**

Delicious, flavorful, meaty fruits have smooth shoulders, not as rough and ridgy as Beefsteak and the blossom end scars are smaller. Prolific, vigorous plants produce luscious red fruits averaging 17 ounces. Indeterminate, 80 days



### **Goliath**

**Personal Favorite!** This is a main season tomato. Its beautiful, smooth, bright-red fruits average 10 to 15 oz., with a sweet luscious flavor. Tall, plants will produce yield after yield of these perfect tomatoes. Multiple disease resistance makes these widely adaptable to any climate. Indeterminate, Hybrid, VFFNASt, 65 days



### **Abraham Lincoln**

This old-time variety really loads up with an abundance of 6 to 10 oz red tomatoes that are packed with great tomato flavor. They have a tender, fine texture and a fair amount of acid that is nicely tempered with sweetness. This variety has been popular since the early 1920's, and it is no wonder considering its productivity and flavor. Indeterminate. 77 days.



### **Legend**

**Personal Favorite!** The battle with blight fungus just took a turn for the better! Legend has shown a strong tolerance to blight strains in even the most virulent regions like the West Coast. Round, shiny red fruits average 4 to 5", with sweet flavor and just a little acid to add a touch of zing. Very nice tomatoes with skin that feels kind of velvety. Determinate, 68 days



### **Alicante**

A tomato variety from Unwins, England, UK. They are big, indeterminate plants that yield above average yields of medium, golf-ball sized, round, red heirloom tomatoes. These tomatoes were an English favorite that were boiled for breakfast. Very tasty, full-bodied with old-time tomatoey flavors. This tomato variety has a good reputation for being a favorite in the tomato garden. 70 days



### Better Boy

A spectacular, midseason variety with plump, juicy, deep red tomatoes that often weigh more than one pound. Fruits are extremely flavorful, with flesh that's juicy, yet firm. Heavy foliage protects fruits from sun-scald. Demonstrates excellent disease resistance, too. Indeterminate, 75 days



### Sweet Seedless

The world's first seedless tomato is here. This totally new tomato is the perfect balance of flavor, sweetness, meat, gel, firmness and juiciness. Like the seedless watermelons and virtually seedless cucumbers we all now enjoy, seedless tomatoes are first-rate for taste and easy to digest. Since the plants don't need to store sugars in the seeds, the tomato's total sweetness is in every rich slice. Indeterminate plants; full-fledged disease-resistance. Indeterminate. 68-70 days



### Big Boy

When Big Boy hybrid tomato debuted in 1949, its incredible productivity and gorgeous, perfect, large red fruit made it an instant hit. What's kept Big Boy tomato a best-selling tomato all these years is the wonderful aroma and rich flavor. The fruits weigh in 10 ounces with many reaching 1 pound or more. Healthy, indeterminate vines produce all summer long. Burpee-bred. Indeterminate. 78 days



### Thessaloniki

Uniform, baseball-sized fruits are the trademark of this variety developed in sunny Greece. Resistant to sunburn, cracks and spots. Perfect blossom ends resemble those of greenhouse tomatoes. Fruits have a pleasant, mild flavor and virtually refuse to rot, even when completely red and ripe. Indeterminate. 68 days



### Kosovo

**Personal Favorite!** This wonderful variety came from a former U.N. worker in Kosovo, who passed it down to Carolyn Male. Huge, deep pink heart-shaped fruit has a sweet rich flavor and is very meaty while still being juicy. Production was excellent for us and the tomatoes are reminded me of an oxheart type. Tomatoes can grow up to 1 pound. Indeterminate. 75-80 days



### Big Beef

Large beefsteak-type tomato with very firm flavorful fruits. Strong vines produce an abundance of 1-2 lb fruits. Indeterminate, 80 days



### Celebrity

This AAS Award Winner established a new standard for main-crop hybrids requiring multiple disease resistance. Highly adaptable from Canada to the South. Medium sized, globe-shaped fruits are crack-resistant and average 7 oz. .Semi-determinate, 70 days



### Delicious

**Personal Favorite!** An excellent slicer, with most fruits over 1 pound - many 2 to 3 pounds - and still holds the world record of 7+ pounds for a single fruit! Produces smooth and solid fruits that seldom crack, with small cavities, nearly solid meat, and excellent flavor. Indeterminate, 77 days



### Big Zac

**Personal Favorite!** This is an exclusive from Totally Tomatoes. Bred by a New Jersey gardener, this enormous tomato can tip the scales at 4 to 6 pounds. (Dependent on growing conditions, of course) It is meaty and delicious and very disease resistant. This is the biggest tomato (2 pounds) I've ever grown and it was delicious. Indeterminate, Hybrid, 80 days



### Keepsake

The first hybrid "long shelf life" tomato designed for the home gardener, and one of the few varieties with "real tomato" flavor! What incredible staying power...this tomato will wait for harvest until you're ready, with no loss of quality! Prolific fruits ripen all over at the same time, from the inside out. Determinate, 70 days



### Mister E

**Personal Favorite!** This is a seed we saved from our Big Zacs. Our seed reverted back to one of it's parent which was a larger, open pollinated pink tomato. It was very sweet and lovely and I will grow it again. Last year, being an unknown, we named it accordingly. Do you feel adventurous? Give one a try and let me know how they turn out. Indeterminate, Hybrid, 80 days

## Unusual



### Giant Tree Tomato

Vigorous 10 to 18 ft. vines have strong stems and heavy thick leaves. Globe- shaped, pinkish-red fruits, with few seeds, are smooth, tender and weigh 1 to 2 lbs. Indeterminate, 90 day.



### **Black Truffle**

**Personal Favorite!** Loved this one. It might be the same as the Japanese Black Trifele. The deep burgundy color, with undertones of purplish-black, is as rich as the flavor. It's high in both sugars and acid, creating a sweet, strong, complex flavor that is hard to beat. These are 6-8 oz. pear-shaped fruits with green shoulders. Indeterminate. 75 days.



### **Lemon Boy**

Lemon yellow, not golden in color. Highly adaptable plants yield large, deep oblate fruits, averaging 6 to 7 oz. and about 3-1/2" across. This was a pretty tomato with clear yellow skin. It seemed to produce in clusters and the taste was mild and sweet. Nice color in a salad. VFNASt, 72 days



### **Carbon**

**Personal Favorite!** Another one I really liked. The tomatoes were large and sweet and pretty. Big, regular-leaf tomato plants yield 10-14 oz., beautiful purple-black, open-pollinated tomatoes. Delicious, rich, complex flavors. This tomato variety won a taste test of 10 heirloom tomato varieties at Cornell Research Farm. Indeterminate, 76 days



### **Tye Dye**

One flavor-full, color-full, beautiful tomato. This breakthrough bicolor gold and red hybrid delivers all the heirloom flavor of Big Rainbow, Pineapple and Georgia Streak—with bigger yields, consistent form and better disease-resistance. The large, smooth 7 oz. fruits, miraculously marbled with red streaks, are lusciously sweet, mild and non-acidic. Indeterminate. 78 days



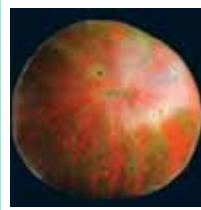
### **Garden Peach**

Small 2 oz. delicate and meaty fruit. Really does have a peach color outside. Hint of red inside. Very mild-sweet taste. Light fuzz on fruit and leaves. A very pretty novelty tomato. 70 days



### **Djena Lee's Golden Girl**

A regular leaf plant that yields huge amounts of 8 -10 oz. yellow fruit. Rich, sweet tomatoey flavor and meaty texture.



### **Chocolate Stripes**

One of the most amazing tomatoes ever grown. For both color and taste, this variety excels. Fruit is deep reddish-brown inside; the outside is covered with beautiful orange and lime colored stripes. One of the most unique looking tomatoes, it is very sweet and yet has a full-rich flavor, and this is the reason this tomato places very high in taste tests. A favorite with the staff at Baker Creek. Fruit is medium to large and are of a slightly flattened globe shape. 79 days



### **Black Prince**

We grew these last year and really liked them. They produce in clusters and are very tasty. Originally introduced from Irkutsk, Russia, it is regarded as a "true Siberian tomato" that does very well in cooler climates. It is so popular in Russia that there's a company in Volograd that is producing an extract of the Black Prince called "*Black Prince Tomato Oil*." These deep garnet, round, 2" tomatoes are full of juicy green flesh and rich fruity flavors. Perfect for eating fresh and cooking. Indeterminate, 75 days



### **Aunt Molly's Ground Cherry (Husk Tomatoes)**

This is a fun "tomato." The flavor was sweet and fruity when allowed to ripen fully and they even came in their own carrying cases. Recorded as early as 1837 in Pennsylvania and still common at roadside stands in late summer. Fruits are 1/2 to 3/4" in diameter and are encased in a papery husk that turns brown. When the fruits are ripe, they usually fall off. It can be used for preserves and pies, over ice cream or in fresh fruit salads. Very prolific. Indeterminate, 70 days



### **Orange Russian**

**Personal Favorite!** This is a first bicolor oxheart tomato and it exhibits the best qualities of both types. Tomatoes weigh 8 ozs. or more and are heart-shaped with smooth golden flesh marbled inside with streaks of red. They are delicious and sweet, somewhat fruity in flavor, and are meaty with very few seeds. Indeterminate. 85 days



### **Black Sea Man**

A Russian Heirloom tomato. Small determinant, potato-leaf plants that yield an abundant set of 12-16 ounce beautiful tomatoes that are rich mahogany colored with olive green shoulders when mature. Inside of tomato is deep, reddish green and loaded with excellent, full-bodied, complex, flavors. This is an outstanding tomato for sandwiches and salads. Black Sea Man heirloom tomato does well growing in mid-sized containers. A great early black tomato. Determinate, 75 days



### **Green Zebra**

This is the most unusual variety you'll ever grow! Fully ripened fruits are bright green, with stripes of a still lighter green. Round, smallish, 2 to 4 oz. fruits have excellent, tart, "real tomato" flavor. Plants are vigorous and determinate. 78 days



### **Dagma's Perfection Tomato Seeds**

A vigorous and abundant producer of medium-sized (3", 12 oz.), slightly flattened, pale-yellow fruits with delicate, light red striping. Deliciously flavorful with overtones of tropical fruit and subtle hints of lime. Firm, juicy and elegant in the mouth, and jewel-like in appearance. 73 days



### **Gary Ibsen's Gold**

Plant produces lots of very juicy, 14 oz. , brilliant orange-gold globes with tropical fruit flavors with enough acid balance to guarantee a burst of tomato delight. It originally came from Tennessee. The seed is from Tomatofest which is owned by Gary Ibsen. This heirloom tomato is sure to become a favorite! 75 days



### **Ananas Noir**

The name of this tomato is French for black pineapple and that is because it arose out of a planting of Pineapple Tomato in a Belgian garden. While its fruit is the same 1 to 1 1/2 lb. size as the Pineapple tomato, the color and flavor are totally different. The exterior is dark purple and green with pink-red splotches and a touch of yellow, while the inside is bright green streaked with pink. The hues bleed into one another reminding one of a piece of tie-dyed fabric. Flavor is special too, sweet yet rich and delicious. Expect large plants and heavy yields. Indeterminate. 80 days.



### **Tigerella**

Huge crops of red fruits with clearly defined yellow-orange stripes. 1-1/2 to 2 inch tomatoes have a rich, tangy flavor and are a beautiful novelty for adding whole or cutting into salads. Indeterminate. 56 days
